

Sustainability in Bangladesh



MetLife Foundation and Shakti Foundation jointly planted 17,000 trees in the dividers across major streets of Dhaka City to help protect the environment and offer a soothing sight of greenery.



BRAC and MetLife Foundation have jointly launched a program to help 3,300 families in the most drought-prone and water-scarce areas of Bangladesh lift themselves out of extreme poverty.



MetLife's 360Health mobile app has been providing comprehensive healthcare solutions, including 24/7 access to doctor consultation, to over 10 lakh users in Bangladesh. For its contribution in addressing the various health concerns faced by individuals in Bangladesh, the app has been recognized as "Mobile App of the Year" by Insurance Asia.



MetLife Bangladesh invested in the country's first internationally certified sustainability bond, issued by Runner Automobiles, which will use the proceeds to provide credit to customers buying low-emissions three-wheel vehicles. Runner also plans to use the funds to build a rooftop solar plant on its manufacturing facility.

Funded by MetLife Foundation and implemented by Swisscontact, project "Sarathi" has helped over 440,000 RMG workers with direct access to financial and economic resilience-building products and services.



MetLife Bangladesh offers "Professional Actuarial Study Scholarship" to students aspiring to become future Actuaries. The scholarship provides full financial support for actuarial study and access to the knowledge and experience of MetLife's international pool of actuaries.



To support the country's economic progression, MetLife Bangladesh has invested over 18,700 crore taka in the country, with a lion's share of investment in government bonds.

To help the county combat the devastating impact of the dengue outbreak, MetLife Bangladesh launched a fast-track dengue claims settlement service and provided customers with over 3 crore taka as claims for dengue-related medical expenses.



MetLife Foundation collaborated with a2i, the UN Capital Development Fund (UNCDF), and MicroSave Consulting (MSC) in supporting entrepreneurs to implement innovative ideas on financial inclusion.
